

Privacy Legislation for Private Practitioners

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Authority: *Health Professions Act*, section 16(2)(i).

Background:

One of the duties and objectives for a college legislated under the *Health Professions Act* is to inform individuals of their legal rights, including privacy legislation. The CDBC is obligated to inform registrants who have private practices of provincial privacy legislation laws.

Policy:

Private practice registrants must meet privacy requirements outlined in the *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act* (PIPEDA or PIPED Act) amended on July 1, 2014.
