Inquiry Case #20-37 - Complaint Outcome Report

On **May 21, 2020**, the registrant concerned by the complaint contacted the College to report that they had forgotten to renew their registration, but had been continuing to practice dietetics in their current employment, even after receiving a letter from the College that confirmed their resignation and reminded them not to use the title and practice dietetics.

On **May 26, 2020**, the registrant renewed late and was advised that the Inquiry Committee would be informed of the matter.

On **June 30, 2020**, the Inquiry Committee met to review and discuss College correspondence with the registrant, the registrant's response and corrective actions. The Inquiry Committee determined that the registrant had breached section 12.1 of the *Health Professions Act*, sections 3 and 4 of the Dietitians Regulation regarding use of the title "Dietitian" and practicing dietetics while not registered, and that the risk of harm was low.

The registrant was informed of the decision on **July 2, 2020**, and consented to an undertaking pursuant to sections 33(6)(c) and 36(1)(a) of the *Health Professions Act* in which the registrant agreed to not repeat using the title "Dietitian" and practicing dietetics while not being registered.

A copy of the signed undertaking is saved in the registrant's file permanently, in accordance with section 69 of the CDBC bylaws.
