

# The CDBC is Recruiting One Public Representative for the Board of Directors

■ Term of office: April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2024



The College is still operating mostly virtual (re: COVID-19 pandemic). Board meetings may be conducted both virtually and in-person. When there is travel, all expenses are reimbursed. Proof of vaccination may be required for in-person meetings.

The CDBC's mandate is to protect the BC public by regulating dietitians to practice ethically, safety and competently. As CDBC's governing body, the Board is responsible for overseeing the strategy, finance, and risk management of the College. The Board's composition is critical to the success of the College's mandate in protecting the public. The CDBC is committed to achieving a diverse directorship, representative of the public it serves and inclusive towards all. The College is also committed to cultural safety within the organization and as an outcome for the public.



Orientation is provided for any new director based on their experience and knowledge. The College provides technical support and training for virtual meetings and our secured platform to access documents. Training is provided to the Board as a collective and is also accessible and available individually.



The Board has a [competency matrix](#) that outlines the desired skills and attributes for its work. Board members are not expected to possess all of the listed skills but rather fulfill them as a collective.



Board members are compensated for their time in accordance with the [per diem policy](#). Normally they meet three times a year (March, June, November) and if needed, attend short teleconferences.



The CDBC encourages expression of interest from people who identify as First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples, members of visible minorities, persons with disabilities, those who identify as 2SLGBTQ+ and other marginalized groups. Applicants with experience in anti-racist work, knowledge of reconciliation, cultural safety and humility, public policy and financial literacy would also be helpful to support the current Board's work.

Public representatives of the Board are appointed by the Crown Agency of Board Resourcing Office (government) based on the recommendation of CDBC. If you're interested by this position, please submit a current resume and a brief statement explaining why you are interested in joining the Board.
