### Inquiry Case #22-65 - Complaint Outcome Report

Between **March 13 and 15, 2023**, a registrant contacted the College to renew Restricted Activity A (design, compound or dispense enteral nutrition) and found out they were not registered with it.

On **March 15, 2023**, the registrant registered with Restricted Activities A for 2022-2023, and renewed the Restricted Activity with their 2023-2024 registration.

On **March 23, 2023**, the registrant met with the CDBC Deputy Registrar to review their employment history and clarify the period of time they had practiced Restricted Activity A without registration. It was found that the registrant had been practicing the Restricted Activity without registration from October 1, 2022 to March 14, 2023. The registrant was advised that the Inquiry Committee would be informed of the matter.

On **June 1, 2023**, the Inquiry Committee met to review and discuss College correspondence with the registrant, the registrant's response, and corrective actions. The Inquiry Committee determined that the registrant had breached section 5 of the *Health Professions Act's* Dietitians Regulation and section 47 of the CDBC Bylaws, regarding the practice of restricted activities while not registered to do so, and that the risk of harm was low.

The registrant was informed of the decision on **June 2, 2023**. The registrant consented to an undertaking pursuant to sections 33(6)(c) and 36(1)(a) of the *Health Professions Act* in which the registrant agreed to not repeat practicing restricted activities without being registered to do so on **the same day**.

A copy of the signed undertaking is saved in the registrant's file permanently, in accordance with section 69 of the CDBC bylaws.

**78 days** were required to resolve the case.
